

4.3. The supplier pays employees at least the minimum wage as set by the relevant state authority.

8.2. The suppliers farm has not been established within the boundaries of formally protected areas **and/or** the supplier has the required permits to allow operation within the protected area(s).

- 9.1. The supplier has not been not apprehended for illegal conversion of natural forests/ecosystems is black listed by the federal government.
