Framework of Timber Regulations

Prevent illegally harvested timber/timber products being placed on GB market

Products within scope listed by commodity code

FLEGT

Distinguishes between operators and traders

Sets out due diligence requirements for operators

CITES

Recycled material

Obligations under Timber Regulations

Operators

- Exercise due diligence when placing timber or timber products on the market for the first time
- Maintain and regularly evaluate the due diligence system it uses

Traders

- Identify the operators or the traders who have supplied the timber or timber products; and
- Where applicable, identify the traders to whom they have supplied timber or timber products.

Due Diligence Systems



Access to Information

- · Description of product
- Species of timber
- Country of harvest
- Quantity
- Supplier or trader details
- Relevant compliance documentation



Risk Assessment

- Third party verification and certification
- Prevalence of illegal harvesting of specific tree species (e.g. REDD List, CITES)
- Prevalence of illegal harvesting in country of harvest
- Complexity of supply chain of timber and timber products
- Sanctions imposed by UN / EU



Risk Mitigation

 Set of measures and procedures to reduce risk to negligible or do not import

REGULATORY FRAMEWORK

 Northern Ireland is covered by Northern Ireland Protocol & European Timber Regulations

ENFORCEMENT OF REGULATIONS

 OPSS responsible for enforcement in both Great Britain and Northern Ireland

Timber Regulations in the UK

Due diligence checks to take place on timber flowing from Great Britain (GB) to Northern Ireland (NI) No new due diligence checks to take place on timber flowing from NI to GB Due diligence checks to take place on timber flowing from the EU to GB No new due diligence checks to take place on timber flowing from the EU to NI


Practical Effects of UKTR

No change in relation to suppliers from outside EU

Due diligence required on products EU → GB

Responsibility with GB operator

Risk within EU varies

CITES


CITES Exemption

- Permit taken as compliance with UKTR





Enforcement Visits


- Request DDS for specific import

Document Verification


- Online resources which gather documentation


Anatomical

Sanctioning Non-Compliance

Advisory Letter

- Business was noncompliant but has since taken appropriate measures
- Seriousness of offence commensurate with advisory letter

Notice of Remedial Action

- Issued where there has been an offence (failure to have or maintain due diligence system)
- Specifies measures to be taken to ensure compliance
- Requires measures to be taken within period specified in the notice

Prosecution

- Sustained refusal to implement due diligence systems / breach of notice of remedial action
- Seriousness of offence is sufficiently grave to warrant prosecution
- Unlimited fine or up to two years' imprisonment



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
