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Overall Objective

To help improve implementation & enforcement of the EUTR.

Objectives

1. Increase capacity among key stakeholders to comply with EUTR
2. Improve availability and quality of information about timber import risks
3. Increase awareness of key stakeholders regarding availability of information and tools, and positive impacts of EUTR



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EUTR Support Phase II – What are we going to do?

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Objective

To help improve implementation & enforcement of the EUTR.

Primary Activities:

1. IMPROVE CAPACITY AMONG KEY STAKEHOLDERS

- 18 regional industry workshops; 12 workshops for CAs; 2 workshops for MOs
- 1 EU wide stakeholder workshop
- 4 training videos

2. IMPROVE AVAILABILITY AND QUALITY OF INFORMATION ABOUT TIMBER IMPORT RISKS

- 4 regional stakeholder networks established (Asia, Africa, Latin Am., EU)
- New Sourcing Hub interface including supply chain mapping tool & legality risk database
- 10 new timber legality risk assessments + country toolkits

3. INCREASE AWARENESS OF KEY STAKEHOLDERS REGARDING AVAILABILITY OF INFORMATION AND TOOLS

- Participation in 18 industry events, 30 international events and 3 events on other commodities
- 6 articles related to other forest impact commodities; 30 articles and news pieces on timber legality
- 3 promotion videos

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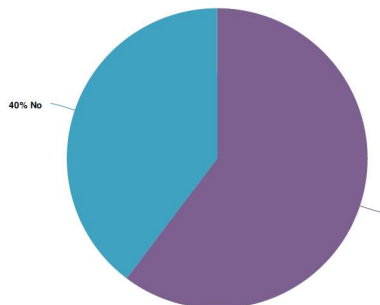

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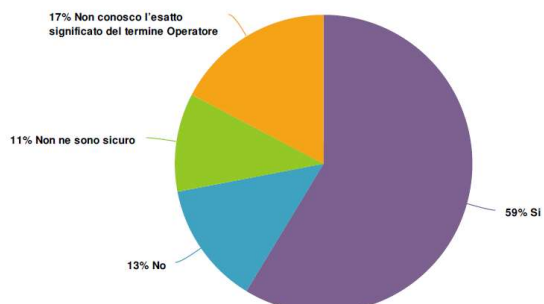
